> We have a number of new academic programs that have been underwritten by generous donors from the Holy Cross Community. These donors are not alumni nor were they associated with Holy Cross before this year. They are civic-minded people who have been blessed with substantial treasure and have opted to give it to Holy Cross. They are building a state-of-the-art STREAM program (Science-Technology-Religion-Engineering-Art-Math) at our school that consists of a new Biology, Physics and Chemistry laboratory; an Engineering laboratory that includes 3-D computers and printers; and a Computer Programming laboratory to teach students how to write computer code and earn certifications in the latest software. Other donors are considering replacing the windows and locks in the labs to keep them secure.

> Our alumni are also contributing for the betterment of Holy Cross by buying a new fleet of buses. By the time you read this, the first two are expected to be on hand. Through the generosity of some of the alumni, Holy Cross continues to flourish. I note that there are over 5,000 alumni who have graduated from our school but less than 10% give back to Holy Cross. I believe it is because most of our alumni have relocated and are now out of touch. Please help us to find them and bring them back into the fold. Imagine how powerful we would be with even just 50% of our alumni giving back.

> In conclusion, I want to reiterate that Holy Cross is led, staffed and supported by the best of the Lord's followers. We are growing and developing programs to provide our students an edge in today's world, however, we will never forget the importance of cultivating the heart along with the mind. Our graduates are prepared to go out into the world and make it a better place. All of this is divinely driven and will continue to thrive as long as you listen to your heart and find the best way to support the Holy Cross mission.

1 The Graduation Rate was 100 percent for 2015-2016.

Out of thousands of applicants that apply each year, Briana is one of the 1,000 talented students nationwide selected for this distinguished and highly competitive scholarship which will cover her Bachelor's, Master's and Doctoral degrees.

The Gates Millennium Scholars (GMS) Program selects 1,000 talented students each year to receive this prestigious scholarship to use at any college or university of their choice. The GMS provides scholars with personal and professional development through leadership programs and academic support throughout their college career.

He remains as he always has been, committed to carrying out the school's mission. Brother Stanley is heavily involved with the "School Choice" movement in Texas which is another one of his passionate interests.





Holy Cross honored Brother Stanley by holding 3 special retirement parties. The separate events allowed many individuals to have a chance to thank him for his years of service and for his continued commitment to education on the Westside of San Antonio. Many stories were shared about Brother including a very touching recollection from Brother William Dooling, a "miraculous acquisition of property" as told by Judge Larry Noll and the amount of respect the community has for Brother Stanley told by Richard Vasquez. From these accounts of those closest to him, there was a joyful reverence from those who witnessed the many ways Brother Stanley touched the lives of so many individuals, both in school and in the community. He continues to be a blessing today in the lives of our students, faculty, administration, patients and the medical community as well as the politicians. His humble presence will always shine.

"Do the right thing at the right time for the right reason," advises Brother Stanley. It is a motto that has guided the decisions of many alumni and those who have had the privilege of getting to know Brother Stanley. It is evident that this motto is continuously lived out in his journey and development of Holy Cross of San Antonio. We will miss Brother Stanley as our leader and President and his work at Holy Cross will be treasured for many years to come. Holy Cross welcomes future leadership who can step in and continue Brother Stanley's legacy and spirit of giving back to the community.



For the first time our Alumni Association organized the annual golf tournament, formerly known as "Dollars Fore! Scholars". "Dollars Fore! Scholars" raised funds for the Br. Our inaugural Alumni Pledge Campaign launched in March 2016 to support renovation of our science labs, computer labs and new buses. The campaign was tied to eligibility

This figure illustrates the magnitude of support from the community Holy Cross serves, strengthening grant applications and increasing the likelihood of funding. We are looking forward to the fruits of our participation. It is through continued participation that we have some great new programs to reach more alumni with different interests.

a newly formed group to Holy Cross Alumni and the San Antonio community is the Holy Cross Young Professionals (HCYP). The group is comprised of alumni that graduated within 1993 - 2014 for the purpose of networking and professional development. Jeret Pena '99, was happy to host the first mixer on July 23, 2016 at the Brooklynite, which is one of his five successful establishments. This is a professional network designed to connect recent college graduates and young

adults with professionals within our Holy Cross community. The HCYP is one of the many projects that was supported by the Alumni Association during the 2015 -2016 school

With the combined revenues generated from the 2015-2016 events and the successes of previous years, we were able to positively impact the Holy Cross campus and community. We invested in a new fence along N. San Felipe, in collaboration with the Holy Cross Booster Club and PTC to protect the student-built Stations of the Cross. We replaced the wood boards on the football field home bleachers, making

> them safer for students and families (appreciated by many parents). We revitalized the area surrounding our Grotto, which was constructed in 2006 by the class of 1971 and is a popular place for the Holy Cross Community to gather. If you stop by the grotto today, you will see new plant life around a number of the trees and along the path leading up to the grotto. We were fortunate enough to sponsor the 2015 Senior Breakfast, the 2015 8th Grade Tours recruitment effort, the 2016 Senior Luncheon, and Brother Stanley's retirement gift. This was made possible by Alumni, family and student volunteer efforts. But there is still more to be done!

#### HOLY CROSS MEDICAL CENTER


